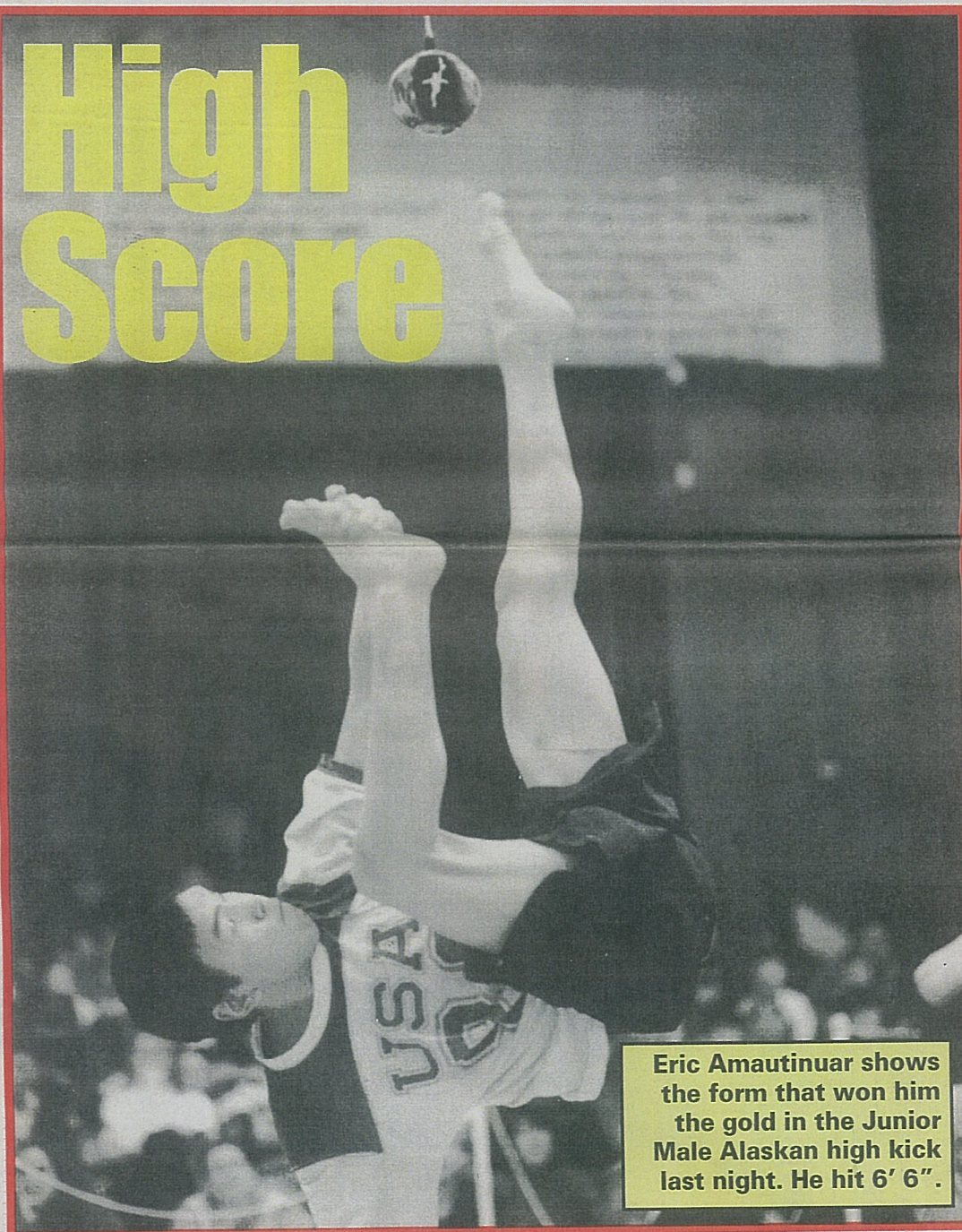

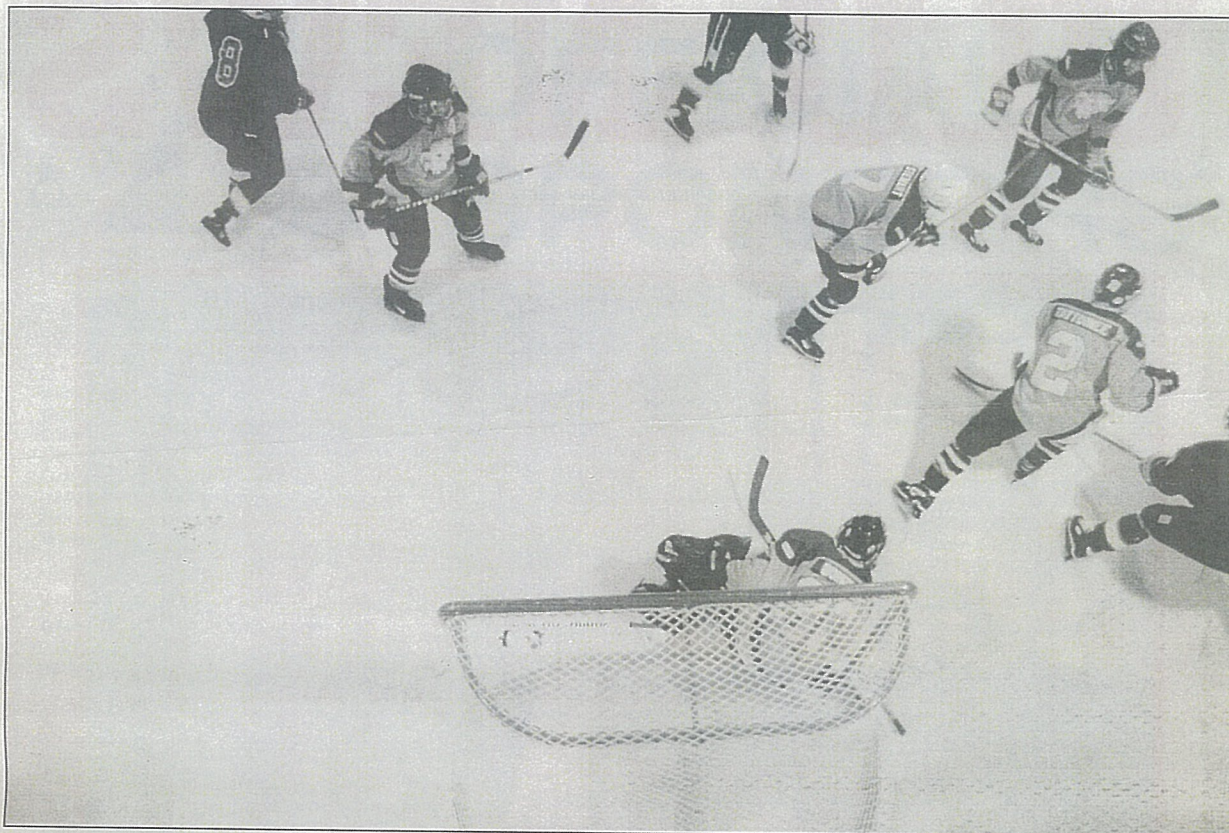


Eric Amautinar shows the form that won him the gold in the Junior Male Alaskan high kick last night. He hit 6' 6".

Big hearts

The Northwest Territories Bantam hockey squad is well acquainted with adversity - but they're not about to back down from the challenges that come their way.

The NWT Bantams got off to a really bad start at the 098 Arctic Winter Games when key player and team leader, Max Kotokak of Tuktoyaktuk, broke his leg in their very first game.

To add insult to injury, the NWT Bantams were thrashed 8-1 by Team Alberta on Tuesday night. However, the NWT all-star team did not roll over and play dead.

"The guys really came through big time," said coach Simon Adams after the NWT rebounded to defeat the Yukon 4-1 on Wednesday. "I'm proud of them - and I hope they can do it again."

Adams had high praise for netminder Joey Borkovic who turned away all but one shot. The NWT coach also give credit to defencemen Ashley Rivers, Charlton Walkie, Jason Froese and Kyle Tattuinne. The foursome not only put in a solid performance on defence but also contributed three out of the NWT's four goals.

The win over arch-rival Yukon boosted the NWT Bantams' record to two wins, one loss and one tie. "The kids are really pumped. This is a big win and it gives us a good change at the gold medal," said Adams.

After three days of marathon competition (168 matches have been played so far), Alberta and Greenland have emerged as the powerhouses in Junior and Juvenile badminton at Range Lake North School.

Alberta and Greenland are also forces to be contended with in the Open competitions, however, the Northwest Territories is also making its traditional strong showing.

Alberta and Greenland are guaranteed spots in the gold ulu final for Junior Men's singles on Friday. Semi-final competition today will see two members of Team Alberta square off against each other, while two members of Team Greenland will do battle for the other gold ulu berth.

The Northwest Territories will be represented in the gold ulu final for Junior Ladies singles because two NWT players face-off in semi-final competition today. Since one NWT player will go for gold and the other bronze, the NWT is guaranteed at least a silver ulu. Alberta is a strong contender for the other gold ulu position in Junior Ladies singles.

Both the Juvenile Men's and Women's singles gold ulu matches will likely be showdowns between Alberta and Greenland.

The gold ulu in the Junior Ladies doubles competition will likely go to Alberta or Greenland. Alberta and Yukon are gold ulu favorites in Junior Men's doubles.

Alberta and Greenland are also considered to be strong contenders for gold ulus in the Juvenile and Junior mixed doubles events.

The gold ulu in Open Women's singles will be likely be contested by Alberta, NWT or Yukon. The strong contenders in Open Men's singles are Alaska, NWT and Greenland.

The NWT and Yukon will likely meet in the finals of both the Open Ladies and Men's doubles competitions. The NWT has a bye into both finals, while the Yukon and Alaska will play-off for the remaining gold ulu berths.

In mixed doubles, Greenland and NWT will play in one semi final, while Alberta and Alaska will play in the other.

The 29 badminton semi-final matches will run from 10 a.m. today until about 4 p.m. The gold, silver and bronze ulu matches will be played at Range Lake North School on Friday from 10 a.m. until about 7 p.m. The ulus will be presented at "The Rock" (St. Patrick's High School) on Friday at 10 p.m.

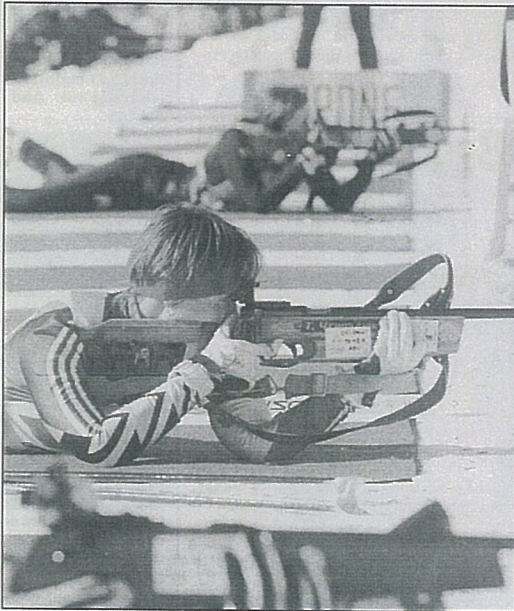

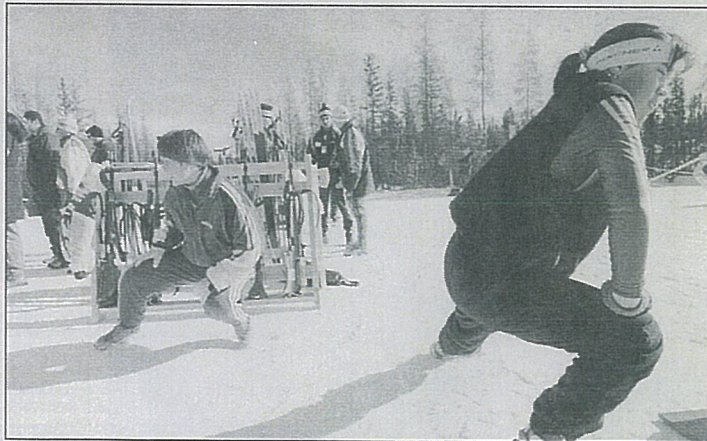

Finding a groove

Youth, elders and everyone in between were clapping their hands when Greenland's musical group Tupaarnaq performed live and unplugged at the Baker Community Centre.

Tupaarnaq is named for the band's 14-year-old lead singer Tupaarnaq Mathiassen who recently released a Christmas CD featuring two songs - despite only performing before live audiences for about a year.

Although Tupaarnaq's renditions of traditional Greenland songs were popular with the audience

at the Baker Community Centre, band members were somewhat nervous during their first Arctic Winter Games performance.

The anxiety attack was prompted by a bad case of the flu that almost sidelined their lead singer. Guitarists Miki Petersen and Albrecht Damgaard say the rest of the band had to sing strong back-up

vocals to aid their ailing vocalist. Coming to the aid of Tupaarnaq were drummer Nino Thomsen, keyboard player Nukannuaq and bass player Hemrik Jenson. To make matters more stressful, Tupaarnaq switched from electric to acoustic instruments for the Arctic Winter Games.

In short, Tupaarnaq's first days in Canada were a bit stressful but they've now settled in a groove. "It's been exciting," says Petersen. "We like it here a lot. The food is very good, but the air is very dry and our lips are cracking!"

The band's hometown, Nuuk, is very different from Yellowknife. "We have lots of cliffs back home and mountains, but no trees." Damgaard adds that Nuuk is a city of about 14,000 people and isn't as spread out as Yellowknife.

Back in Nuuk the band usually performs a wide range of music such as polkas, current pop hits, traditional Greenlandic songs and even heavy metal!

The members of Tupaarnaq are amateur musicians who perform for fun at venues such as dances and festivals.

After the band's first performance on Greenland's national day in Katuaq in 1997, they were asked to perform at the 1997 Nuuk Festival, the City of Manitoq's anniversary celebration and on the live entertainment program Aliikkustarfik.

Band members hope to watch their Greenland athletes in action but are looking forward to being almost too busy performing for the rest of the week!

Keeping the kids busy

Even the kids are getting down to business during the Arctic Winter Games and when 40 or 50 children gather for singing and face painting and movement workshops, it's a serious affair.

Led and organized by long-time Yellowknifer Sue Starr, the afternoon activities happen daily in the lobby of NACC from 2 to 3:30 p.m. and revolve around the more traditional side of indigenous and Northern life.

Yesterday saw the active little tykes involved in face painting and bead-work, both elements of Northern life that have been celebrated during the cultural component of the Arctic Winter Games.

While the workshops are open to any children passing through Yellowknife during the games, Starr says "it's geared for the kids from the community really. We're getting kids from three (years of age) to ten and it's going great. This is the first day we're not actually having

guest performers singing songs and doing motion stuff," says Starr, 53.

Today's afternoon will be hosted by Jim Green, a storyteller from Fort Smith who plans to tell stories and teach the participants how to draw and write their own tales.

Green will be joined by Renee Lelievre, an American sign language instructor who will teach the kids how to sing a song using sign language.

Starr, who first volunteered to run the Kidstuff program in May of 1997, says it has gone off without a hitch to date and that she "really like working with kids."

She is assisted in her efforts by 15 volunteers who range from their pre-teen years to adulthood.

The week closes on Friday afternoon with performances by the cultural contingents including the Pey Wapun Dancers, Alaska Northstar, the Chief Jimmy Bruneau School Drummers, Tupaarnaq and Jim Green.



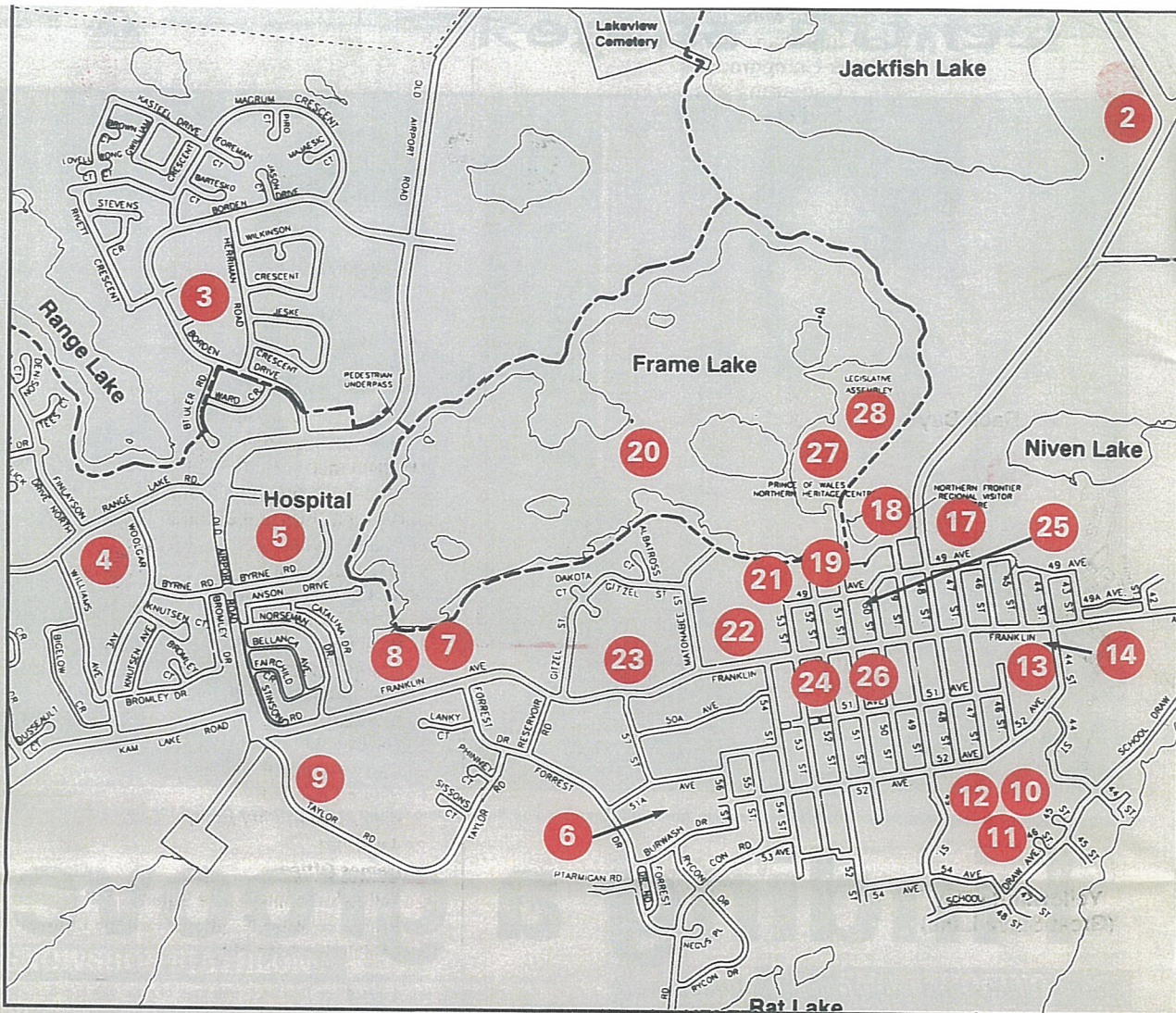

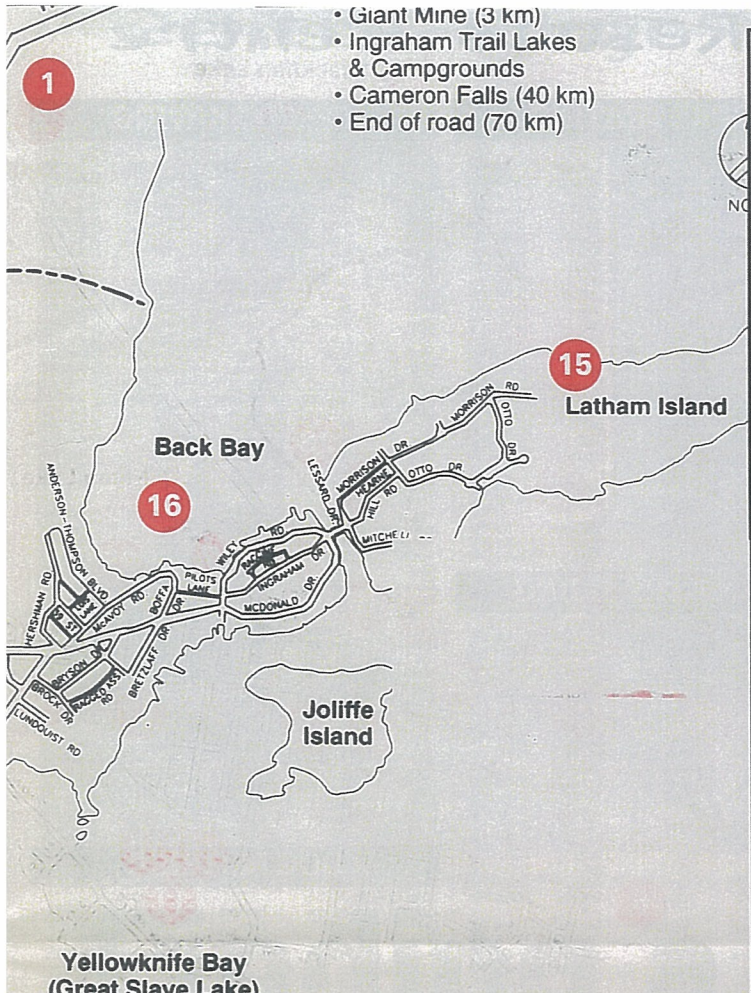

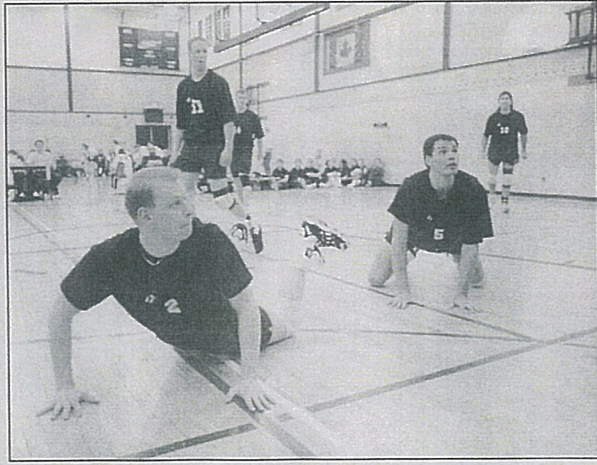

Members of Team Alaska are Colin Hufman, Martin Sather, Tom Hewitt and Thomas Kent.

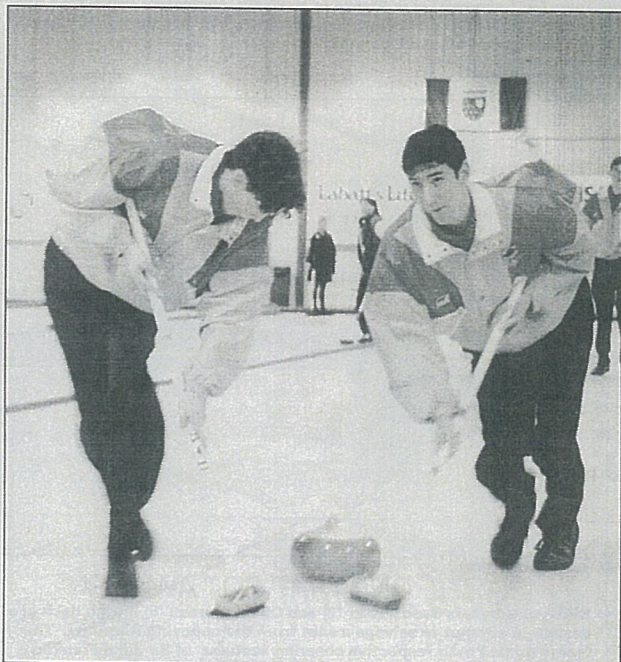
