Team Alaska gets new look to jerseys

When Team Alaska's female basketball team had their jerseys misplaced, AWG Basketball Chair Brendan Toner reached out to high school athletic directors in Fort McMurray to find a solution.

Craig Hurley from Holy Trinity High School told us he had some jerseys in his office and said they could supply Alaska with basketball uniforms.

"Brendan gave me the specifics (number of jerseys, sizes, etc) and I confirmed with him that Holy Trinity had what they needed," said Hurley. "I knew all of our uniforms would say Knights on them and thought that there was something more that could be done."

That's when Hurley got on the phone with their design and digital media teacher Megan Loxam, explained the situation, and asked if it would be possible to print Alaska somewhere on the uniforms.

"We went to the school Sunday evening, collected the proper size uniforms and used the school's shirt press so that the jerseys then read "Alaska Knights". I dropped the uniforms off Monday morning at Ecole McTavish, where the girls' basketball is being held, and was happy to hear that the uniforms worked for the Alaskan team."

Local artist creates Arctic Winter Games Hodgson Trophy pin bag

A design by Métis, multi-disciplinary artist Stacey Grant, has been selected to create a pin bag the Arctic Winter Games which will celebrate sportsmanship.

The Wood Buffalo 2023 Arctic Winter Games Host Society in collaboration with the Arctic Winter Games International Committee (AWGIC) invited Indigenous artists to participate in a design competition to create a pin bag as part of the Hodgson Trophy award.

Artists were encouraged to produce a design centered around the theme of team spirit and togetherness. The winning artist, Grant, created a bag that draws inspiration from Indigenous traditions, local beauty, and the spirit of the Games.

Northern Lights — "My idea was to really focus on and include the northern lights on this bag. When I think about the RMWB, I think Northern Lights, last year we had the

most beautiful Northern Lights. It's my belief that they are our ancestors dancingnow watching these athletes." Explained Stacey.

Ancestors — Staying with the theme of ancestors, Grant used vintage beads in her creation some over a hundred years old. "Some of these beads may have been from my ancestors, others came from our local environment, this was really important to me. Whoever wins this trophy will be taking a piece of Fort McMurray home with them."

Creation Story — She also used Muskrat fur as a nod to creation story, known to many Indigenous communities. "It was the Muskrat, the smallest member of the team with the biggest spirit that was able to bring the world back. For me, that spoke to these Games, it doesn't matter your size or your stature, it's your spirit that will carry these athletes through."

Nature and Life — Another element is the floral motif- this is based in Métis beadwork teachings.

Diversity — The bag uses three different hides, all different shades to represent the diversity in the RMWB has in the community. "Our Region has one of the most diverse populations, the different shades of hides represent the different skin tones which make up our region, something to be celebrated."

Chef de Mission - Megan Cromarty: After working with Team Yukon for several years, this will be Megan Cromarty's first Games representing as the team's Chef de Mission. The Chef de Mission is the support behind all the teams, athletes and coaches ensuring the logistics and administration is in place for the teams to succeed.

"It's so exciting to see Team Yukon, and all the athletes able to compete. It was a little bittersweet after the cancelled Games in Whitehorse, and then the delay on these Games,

There are athletes who have unfortunately aged out and won't have the opportunity to compete or experience a home Games. What we saw was a ton of resilience come out of these athletes, now they're ready to start a new chapter," Megan said.

Continuing a Legacy: Team Yukon has participated in every Games since its inception in 1970 with Whitehorse hosting the Games six times. The 2020 Games would have marked the seventh time for the city when the pandemic struck and forced the Games to be cancelled.

Spirit of the Games: "I'm so looking forward to the team's Games experience. There's something special about the atmosphere, competing in a Games is so special, the friends you make, it's a cultural and personal experience like no other." Megan explained.




