

"When the dogs took the inside corner, the sled careened to the outside and caught a snow patch and flipped. We were going really fast, so Thit really hard."

Thrown from her sled, the mishap snapped her left collarbone and left the 16-year old Whitehorse racer unable to move, while her six dog team charged off, driverless.

Fortunately, Yukon mission staffer and racing co-ordinator Bernard Menelon was right there with a van and was able to transport Tiffany to the venue where first aid and an ambulance took over. The dogs were soon retrieved.

·Tiffany's story doesn't end there.

Up at the hospital, emergency staff were preparing to cut her prized Team Yukon jacket. But their patient would have none of it.

"I needed it to be in the sport. I thought I was still going to be able to race! So they rolled me over and got the jacket off that way."

Did it hurt?

"Oh yes, it hurt," she giggled with a grimace. Even though she's sidelined from competition -- she'll be wearing a back brace and an arm sling for the next six weeks -- Tiffany's down on the ice every day and doing whatever she can to cheer her other teammates on.

She's also getting a lot of attention, and a lot of help... it was bit of a surprise to find she couldn't tie her own shoelaces with just one hand.

Not a sport for the timid, dog mushing earlier cost Tiffany a few bruises when she got her wrists tangled up in the traces and her team took off. She went along for the ride, or rather the drag, that she says lasted more than a mile.

Admittedly stubborn, she'll stick with mushing. So far, it's her pick over ballroom dancing.



The atmosphere at the N'dilo gym was festive, happy and relaxed as elders. spectators and youngsters all mingled, laughed and applauded the teams and

To the throbbing double-beat of caribou skin drums

and throaty chanting from Dettah and N'Dilo elders and youth drummers from Rae Edzo, teams of four squared off in best-of-three contests. In the end, Yukon take the gold, followed by Alaska and NWT.

The objective: each side

must guess who on the other side is hiding a pebble or coin in his hand.

The teams kneel on the

floor, about three feet apart. The communication is ges-tures and body language using the arms and hands, all the while rocking, bobbing and swaying to the rhythmic beat of the drums and chants.

As each guess is right or wrong, short colored sticks are exchanged to mark the score. When enough sticks end up with one side, the match is over, usually less than ten minutes.

It was the first gold in Dene Games for the Yukon team of Jordan Caesar, John Acklack, Duane McGinty and Edwin McGinty.

What makes Yukoners the best stick gamblers?

"We've got a lot of team spirit and cheering going on all the time," said McGinty. "Mostly it's because we play every day," added Caesar. The two Yukoners noted one

difference in the NWT -here, it's exclusively a male event, while in Yukon, women have been playing for years.

Dene Games wraps up today with the finger pull, starting at 1:30 p.m. at the N'dilo gym.

World champion Alexander Tasmanov, a superbly conditioned athlete, bounded over 603 sledges to take the gold in men's arctic games competition last night. He lead his Tyuman team to sweep all the medals in the mens event.

Two of the most gruelling, demanding event on the entire Games menu thrilled capacity crowds at Sissons School last night.

The first event featured the ancient Russevery turn, it was a far cry from his astoning world record of 870. ian game of sledge jumping, also the newest edition to the Games roster. And predictably,

the Tyumans swept the course.

Sledges are what many Northerners would call a komatik. The traditional way was to tip them on their side, spaced close together, then, both feet together, hop over them. Whoever jumped the most before crashing, or collapsing, was the winner.

The modern version, imported by the Tyuman and Magadan athletes, replaces the sledge with spindly wooden frames, ten in a row. Athletes hop the course, twist around, take a five-second break and jump again. And again. And again.

Krista Andre, a gymnast turned arctic sportster for Team Yukon, was gasping after 35 jumps. Asked what made this event so difficult, she had one word.

'Breathing.'

Undisputed world mens sledge jumper Alexander Tasmanov, 31, did the whole course 60 times without faltering (about 15 minutes) for the gold medal title at 602 sledges. Even with the help of his team-

It's obvious from the moment that Tiffany Setters steps onto the ice that this young Alaskan figure skater is someone Special. Northern News Services

Coach Cindy Solberg describles 11year-old Tiffany as a hard-working and dedicated skater who demands perfection from herself - but there's more than that to this exceptional young person. Young Tiffany exudes grace and composure that seem well beyond her years.

The crowd and judges at the Yellowknife Community Arena last night obviously agree. Tiffany skated away with a bouqet of flowers and a Beanie Baby that the approving crowd tossed onto the ice after her performance. She also collected a third gold ulu by winning the Prelimary Ladies' Free Skate

In an interview following her gold ulu performance, a beaming Tiffany says she was "pretty nervous" and "very excited" going into the Free Skate. Tiffany says her performance "could have been better" but coach Solberg says she thought Tiffany "did

She did really great. She had one little bobble, she only made one mistake and that was in a new jump that she was performing for the first time in competition," says Solberg who coaches Tiffany with Rory Burghart.

Preliminary Ladies Elements event on Monday evening. She received a sec-ond gold ulu the same evening when Alaska won the Team Compulsory Elements event.

Tiffany's interests outside of figure skating include ballet, jumping rope and going fishing and four-wheeling with her father. However, her dedication to figure skating over the past three-and-a-half years doesn't leave her with much spare time.

Solberg estimates that Tiffany practises skating up to two hours every day in addition to on and off-ice conditioning. "She skates a lot," says Solberg. "Every day she gets up early and skates before school and then again after

"She puts her all into skating and she has high expectations from herself,' savs Solberg.

The Pin Report

So what does it take to make a by Brad Heath Northern News Services great pin trade?

"It's all in the environment, the moment," says George Smith, ULU News' correspondent on the trading market here at the '98

We've all seen it - the unspoken signal that flashes between total strangers as they eye each other's lapels, ball caps and vests for the one pin they might not have

No further introductions are needed. Within seconds, the twosome becomes a fivesome or more as bystanders join in the action. One new entry this week, although it's not an official AWG pin, is the NWT coaches design (a pewter rectangle) that was just issued yesterday and is in circulation among Team NWT coaches of all venues. The Pin Report also uncovered an exclusive handmade design by Judy McKinnon of Whitehorse. She's here with her husband Ken, former Yukon commissioner, and both have been great boosters of the Games since their beginning.



Here's Team Alberta's official pin fleet. The three-part ulu pin features their sunburst design, along with Games mascot Lupi and a stylized mountain vista. The gold minister's pin, and a colored enamel duplicate, are rated 'good'.

Judy's designs combine traditional beading with small safety pins in miniature cascades of color. She makes a bracelet, too, and claims her "Friendship" creations are the best way to make friends. And yes, she will trade them!

What's the cost of getting to the Arctic Winter

Games? Northern News Services

Plenty, if you're an athlete or coach from Magadan. If you're from Tyuman or Alberta, nothing. Each of the seven con-tingents at these '98 Games in Yellowknife had a different approach to fund-ing their teams, and whether or not a direct cash contribution was required from each person. Here's a brief, but not necessarily comprehensive survey, of how the

various plans work: Alberta: No direct cost, but some athletes may be required to pay a fee to their respective sports organization, said Roger Kramer, assistant chef de mission. Alberta's AWG participation is co-ordinated and funded by Alberta Sport, Recreation, Parks and Wildlife, a provincial government corporation and through lottery funds. Corporate support is not extensive. Alaska: \$450US (about \$630 Canadi-

some reliance on corporate and service club dollars. "It's not easy to put together financially. You're on pins and needles right to the end," said Loren Smith, Alas-

ka chef de mission. Greenland: 1500 kroner (about \$300 Canadian) each. Heavy additional funding comes from government and corporations, and co-ordination services from the Homeland sports federation. Athletes are strictly monitored for school and regular practice attendance as another condition of travel to AWG, said Grace Nielsen of the Team Greenland mission staff.

Magadan: \$2100US (about \$2900 Canadian) each, or the full cost. Magadan had no play-offs and could only issue an invitation to those who could afford it to make up their delegation. "It's a very difficult financial situation now, from when we were i=Fagle River in 1996," said Lucy Ptchelkina, of the Team Magadan mission. The government did pay the way for the 3 mission staff.

Northwest Territories: Up to \$530 each, based on a separate fee scale for each of the three competitive stages:

regional, territorial and the Games themselves. Regionals, depending on travel costs were \$30 to \$175. If you made it to the Territorial play-offs, it was another \$80 for juniors and \$130 for seniors. All participants to the actual Gams paid another \$225. Assistant chef de mission Gail Nesbitt said corporate sponsors, and government, make a big part of the overall revenue for Team NWT.

Tyuman: No direct cost. Arctic sports competitor Alexander Tasmanov said the Tyuman government paid all costs for all competitors. Tyuman does hold regional run-offs to pick competitors.

Yukon: Fees range from \$260 for adults, \$245 for juniors and \$210 for coaches and mission staff. But chef de mission Vern Haggard said a lot of Team Yukon members helped sell tickets for a big lottery, and built up credit that way. The lottery was a \$2 ticket for a trip for four to Hawaii. For each ticket sold, the seller got \$1.40 in credits. Some government funding, and Yukon held back on gorporations this year, as they'll get tapped in 2000 when Whitehorse hosts the

Diane E. Benson, the producer and director of the Alaska Northern Star Performers, says most people are well educated about Alaskan Inuit culture but know relatively little about the Tlingit and Athabascan peoples.

One of the goals of the Alaska Northern Star Performers is to share their cultures through stories and traditional songs and dances, says Benson. Another important goal is to share a message of sobriety.

Every member of the Alaska Northern Star Performers is also a member of Naa Ludisk Gwai Yatxi, a Tlingit Haida and Tsimpsian dance group whose name means "Childen of the Island who still learn," says Benson.

The Alaska Northern Star Performers was formed about three months ago to provide a vehicle for members of the dance group to"...use certain songs they wouldn't be able to use anywhere else." Benson also has a personal goal is to promote native theatre. "None of our performers are trained actors - except what they're learning from me as we go along.

Members of the Alaska Northern Star Performers are 14-year-old Helen Setuk, Eva Jackson, Ben Schliefman, Ryan Olsen and Latseen Benson. Diane E. Benson also performs in addition to producing and directing the troupe.







Down but not out

Alaska may be a basketball powerhouse , but no one is counting the NWT out of the running for gold ulus. by Brad Heath Northern News Services

Alaska Junior Men's coach Frank Ostanik was pleased with yesterday's 80-67 win but had some reservations about his team's performance.

"I know you should always be happy with a win, but I think we were a little up and down today," says Ostanik, "We have to play better, especially if we're playing this Northwest Territories

Although the Alaska Junior Men are undefeated in three outings, Ostanik says they were almost upset by the NWT when the teams last met. "We've had trouble with the Northwest Territories. We had a 22-point lead at one point and they cut it to two."

The Alaskan team has had to overcome a number of challenges this week. The team has been playing together for less than a week, they've had to adapt to new rules for the AWG and they've had to overcome fatigue from playing two games in a single day.

'Our kids could have found excuses to lose, but instead

they've found excuses to succeed," stays Ostanik.

The Alaskan Junior Women's team defeated the NWT by a score of 75-49. The NWT was within three points of Alaska at the half (33-30) but fell behind early in the second half and was

never able to narrow the scoring gap.

NWT coach Evelyne Wilson says that although her team has a record of one win and three losses, they still have a shot at


