

Father Rene Fumoleau

French missionary remembers when...

The following are excerpts from stories told by Father Rene Fumoleau at the Miners' Mess story telling on Tuesday night.

Fumoleau was born in France in 1926 and came to Canada as a young missionary in 1953 at age 27. The first community he lived in was Fort Good Hope until 1960 after which he lived in Fort Franklin and then back to Fort Good Hope. He has been in Yellowknife since 1970. Among his accomplishments Father Fumoleau has learned to speak North Slavey, has written a book about northern land claims "As long as this land shall last," and has done two movies with the Dene. He is also well-known for his beautiful photography of landscapes and people.

"I came in 1953, went to Fort Good Hope, And I'm quite happy I was here in these days because it was still a land of freedom. The government was really far away - the Territorial government was in Ottawa. The administration centre was in Fort Smith so we were quite free to do whatever we wanted there. Then he'd ask all kinds of questions and I tried to answer, you know the best way I could. And the final question was: 'Do you travel by dog team in winter?'

l'd say, 'ya.' He said, 'you travel a

I'd say, 'ya, about 2,000 miles or so every winter.

'Oh. Are you sometimes by yourself on the trail, just with the dogs without having the oc cassion to talk to anybody else?'

I'd say, 'ya, sometimes for two or three days, just by myself.'

And the Bishop would say, 'do you talk to the dogs?'

I say, 'of course I talk to the dogs. I mean, no-body else to talk to.'

And he would say, 'do the dogs answer you?'

And I say, 'no.' And the Bishop would say, 'well that's okay, you're good for another

The Best Teachers

I came to Fort Good Hope after 20 years of school. I had learned French of course, and a bit of Latin and Greek. And I discovered it was not very helpful in Fort Good Hope. When I got there I didn't know a word of English or a word of the Dene language so that was cultural shock. Anyway, the people there were very patient with me and a few years later you know
— I go back to Fort Good Hope off and on —and am getting older so I like to tell the old stories and talk about the good old days and sometimes I ask the people there, I say, 'do you remember what I said or what I did on such a day, or such a place or when we were out travelling together?' And people say 'yes.' And 'It must have

looked very stupid to And they said, 'yes'. And I said, 'Well why

federal government decided that the Indian people were recognized as Canadian citizens and that they had the right to vote; you know, and thats just a little more than 20 years ago. So in 1957 or '58

there was election to the federal parliament. And to Fort Good Hope comes a lawyer from Yel-lowknife, all dressed up you know —three-piece suit, white shirt and tie, fancy hat, shining shoes, and he said I want to have a meeting. I'm running for the House of Commons so I want a meeting. So the word goes around in the community and there's an old community hall made of logs and there's no furniture there just the walls and the floor. So maybe 50, 60 people gather there and sit on the floor all around the wall, and that man came there and he said, 'I don't speak your language, I need an interpreter.' And somebody says, 'well George is the best inter-

next month you will have nurse. the honor and the The privilege to exercise your franchise. Mr. interpreter?

And the interpreter looks at him and says, can you talk of something else?'

Next, please Anyway, a week later Merv Hardy comes along and he is running for the other party, and Merv comes there and he sits on the floor like every-body else and he said, 'you know, okay boys, next month there's an election, you're going to vote. You know what that means? It means there are two guys run-ning, the other guy and me, what you have to do is say, who is the better? And you, all of you S.O.B.'s, you better vote for me

'Yay! yay!' (hooping, hollering and lots of hand clapping). He got all the votes in the community. If there are politicians here, you know that the process is better

The people there were very patient and it's not very easy to get them too excited. I remember in springtime one day I was sleeping very soundly and suddenly I heard something, (knock, knock, kno knock...knock, knock) and it takes me a long time to wake up usually, even if the phone rings. So finally I wake up half of my brain and say, 'is there somebody there? because the door was not locked you know, everybody walked in. And somebody say, 'yes,'

they say, 'it's me.'
'Oh,' I say, 'who is me?'
He said, 'it's Joe.' 'Oh,' I say, 'well what happened Joe?'

'Well,' he say, 'you know Father, I know you have to sleep like everybody because you work during the day, so you know, you have to sleep at night and you need to have a rest like everybody else.

And I said, 'Yes.' But he said, 'I just

And he came just to us and there was not much security around you know, a few security people but they were far behind. So the Prince comes to that lady I was talking to, and he said, 'hello.' And she said.

And he said, 'what's your name?

'Well, I'm Mary so-

'Oh,' he said. 'Well. where are you from? 'I was born here.

'Oh, you were born here. That's nice.

And she said, 'And you,' and you know she's got that cob, 'and you sir,

where are you from? And Prince Charles says, 'Well, I come from London!

'Oh, you mean London, England?

'Yes,' he said, 'London, England!

'How did you come here?'

'Well I flew from London to Toronto and from Toronto to Edmonton and from Edmonton to Yellowknife.

'Oh ya. Are you going to stay here or are you going back to London?'

He said, 'I'm going back to London.

'How are you going there?










A self-styled aggressive player, Wendy has played in eight AWGs, coached in one, umpired in one and missed one.

In competition, she plays to win but isn't too disappointed is she loses provided it's a good close game. She stresses the requisites for success are speed, agility, strength, fitness and hard work, but readily admits she may not have all of these attributes now.
