Civeo's Athabasca Lodge has transformed into the official Participants Village for the Wood Buffalo 2023 Arctic Winter Games. Over 2,000 athletes, coaches, mission staff and officials have been arriving from across the Circumpolar North since Wednesday.

Tom Davies, Civeo's Vice President of Canadian Operations, said Civeo's hospitality and operations teams had been preparing for months with anticipation.

During normal operations, Civeo's lodge properties are primarily occupied by guests who travel into the region to work with one of the many oil and gas producers in the area. It's essentially their home away from home while they are working in Wood Buffalo.

With a broader range of age groups from different countries and with more guests expected in-house in the middle of the day, Civeo adjusted to support participants during their stay.

They have worked closely with the host committee to offer food and beverage services that address the unique needs of athletes and performers, developing a menu with a variety of healthy, nutrient-dense, high-protein, vegan, vegetarian, and gluten-free options. Participants will also be able to enjoy some featured traditional First Nations menu items including elk, bison, and salmon.


Games flag up



YMM welcomes 2,000 Games passengers

The past week has been exciting at Fort McMurray International Airport (YMM) as over 2,000 participants arrived for the Wood Buffalo 2023 Arctic Winter Games. Team Alaska was the last to set foot at YMM on Saturday night in the Alaska Airlines Salmon-30-Salmon, a Boeing 737-800 painted with a giant fish on the aircraft.

Air Greenland's Airbus A330 caught the most attention as it was the largest aircraft the airport had land at its terminal. Aviation enthusiasts from across Western Canada and residents came to witness the historic moment. The flight brought over 100 Greenland athletes and guests.

"YMM had the capacity to handle the Air Greenland Airbus A330 and the aircraft had its own designated parking lot to accommodate its size," said Cuyler Green, Fort McMurray Airport Authority's (FMAA) Vice President of Operations. "This was an exciting opportunity for YMM to be used at its full capacity."

Green explained that YMM staff had completed numerous surveys to ensure the Greenland Airbus maneuver around the airport. designated parking lines were painted to accommodate the aircraft and allow appropriate bridge positioning.

Specialized equipment was also brought to Fort McMurray to handle the baggage coming off the aircraft.

Thanks to the Fort McMurray Airport Authority and its YMM community, passengers received a warm welcome from 2023 AWG volunteers with music from DJ Jon QPid, cheer routines from Fort McMurray's Northern Cheerleading All Stars and handouts of Canadian treats, Tim Hortons Timbits.

FMAA is already working towards the next steps to help ensure excitement continues for their journey home, after the Closing Ceremonies on February 4.

Team Alberta North gains home advantage

Chef de Mission - Michelle Deering: Michelle has been involved in multi-sport games since 2000, beginning with the Special Olympics, then as a volunteer in 2005 at the Canada Summer Games. Her introduction to the Arctic Winter Games was in 2008 as a Mission staff.

"This is my seventh Arctic Winter Games that I've been involved in; as Chef de Mission, this will be my second, but it will be my first that I'll be able to see through to completion!" explained Michelle, as the 2020 Games were cancelled.

Magic of the AWG: "It's really about the athlete development and the cultural exchange," said Michelle on why these games are so special. "It's also highlighting those traditional sports, especially for us in Alberta North, we don't get to see a lot of this year-round so to expose others to these Dene games and traditional sports is a real experience." Michelle continues.

Home Games: It's going to be great for our athletes to have that home support that is so important but we're also just so proud to be able to compete and participate here in our home province, we're ready to welcome the other contingents!" said Michelle on being the host contingent. Alberta North joined the Arctic Winter Games in 1986 and hosted for the first time, back in 1994 in Slave Lake.

The Wood Buffalo 2023 Arctic Winter Games Committee organized a torch wrap design contest in February 2021, where Trevor Snook was selected as the winning artist.

The design had to reflect traveling and connections, the interconnectedness of the communities in the Wood Buffalo region and celebrate everyone's time to shine.

Snook is a gifted artist from the Flat Bay area in Newfoundland. While he usually paints with oil on canvas or hardboard, Trevor explores a variety of mediums such as antler sheds, helmets and even motorcycles.

Drawing on his Mi'kmaq (First Nation) heritage, he also creates culturally based crafts and tools, such as animal calls and snowshoes. His broad creativity and resourcefulness comes as no surprise to friends and family. Many say that he gets his creative side from his grandfather, Anthony White, who was a well-known carpenter and spruce root basket maker.
