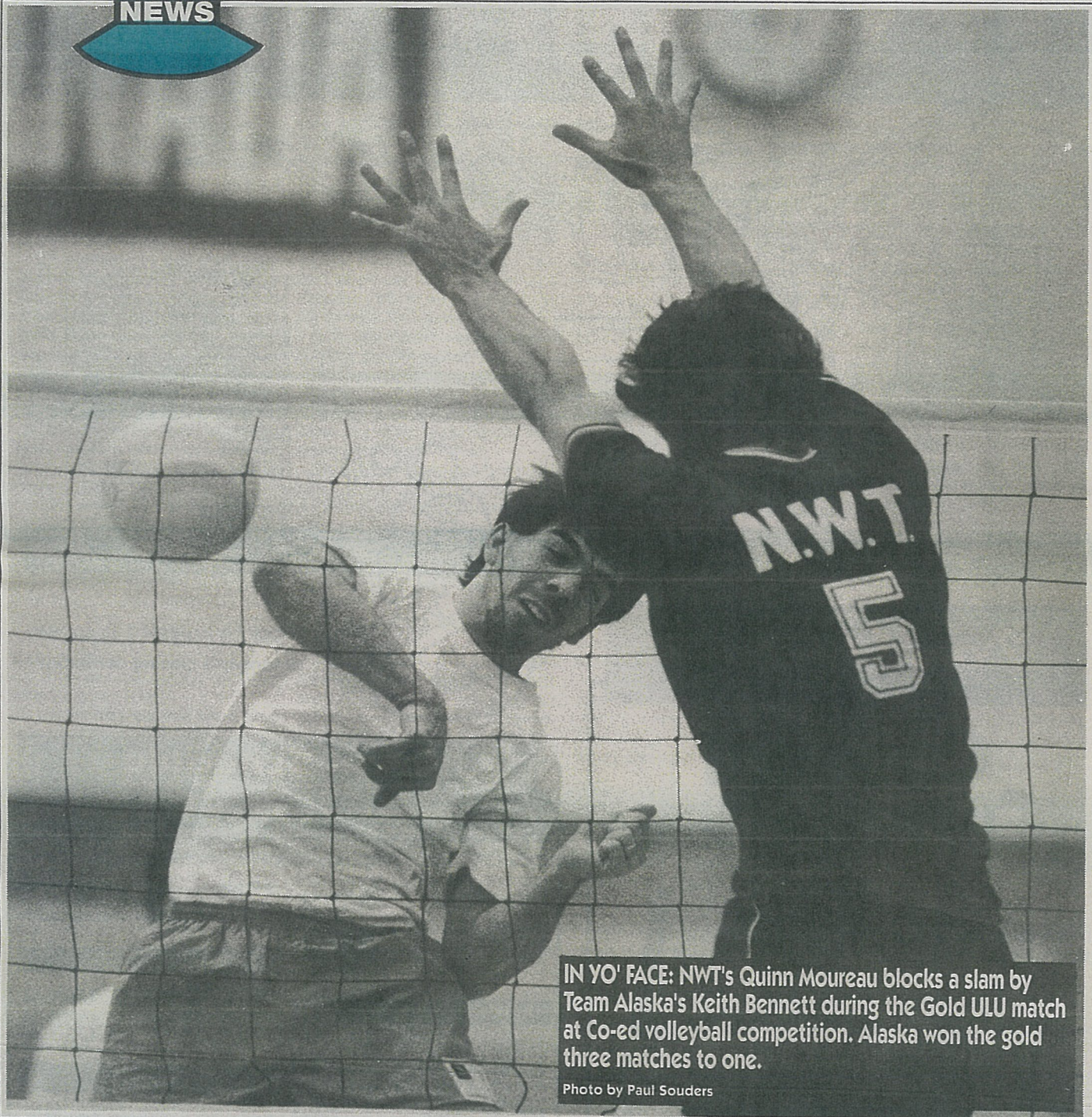

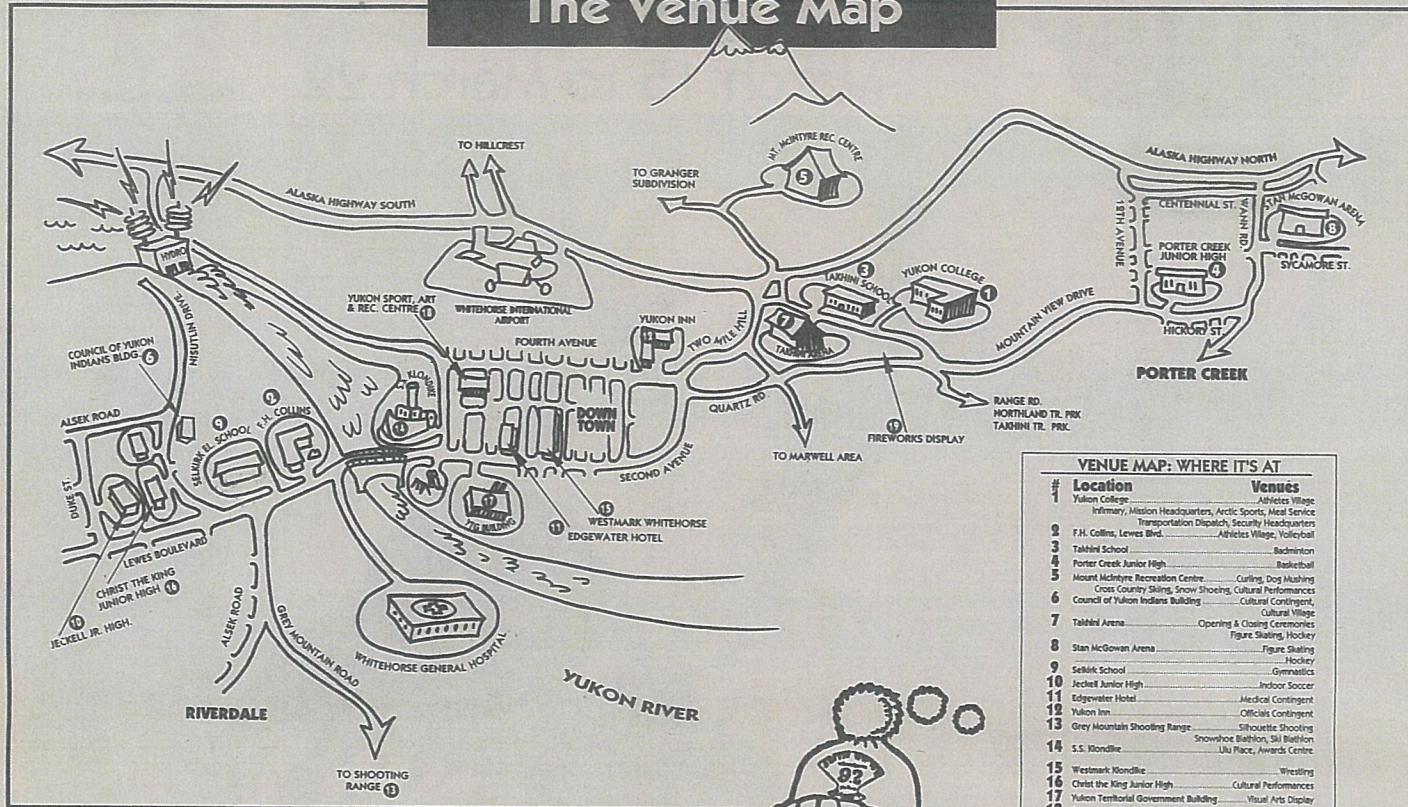

Flyin' Brian Randazzo has done it again

Slowed by injuries, he wasn't doing any record chopping, but the human helicopter still managed to land two gold ulus and one silver.

Thursday night in front of a large crowd at Yukon College, Randazzo captured the one-leg high kick crown with a leap of nine feet, three inches. Add to that a silver ulu in the Alaskan high kick and another gold in the two-foot high kick, and you've quite an AWG resume.

Randazzo's astonishing athletic abilities may allow him to be the first person to slam dunk a basketball with his feet. Despite the obvious gratification that he gets from achieving the great heights in the arctic sports, one still has to wonder how he gets his kicks. Perhaps he's got some Australian ancestors (as in the kangaroo).

Randazzo's teammates Stanley Swezoff (silver ulu) and Travis Cronin (bronze) closed out the podium in the one-leg high kick.

The Alaskan team vaulted past the century mark on Friday as they continue to run away with the lead in the ulu race.

Alaska (51 gold, 31 silver, 34 bronze) set the pace early with their domination of the arctic sports, while the Yukon (23 gold, 34 silver, 18 bronze) continues to put up big numbers in second spot.

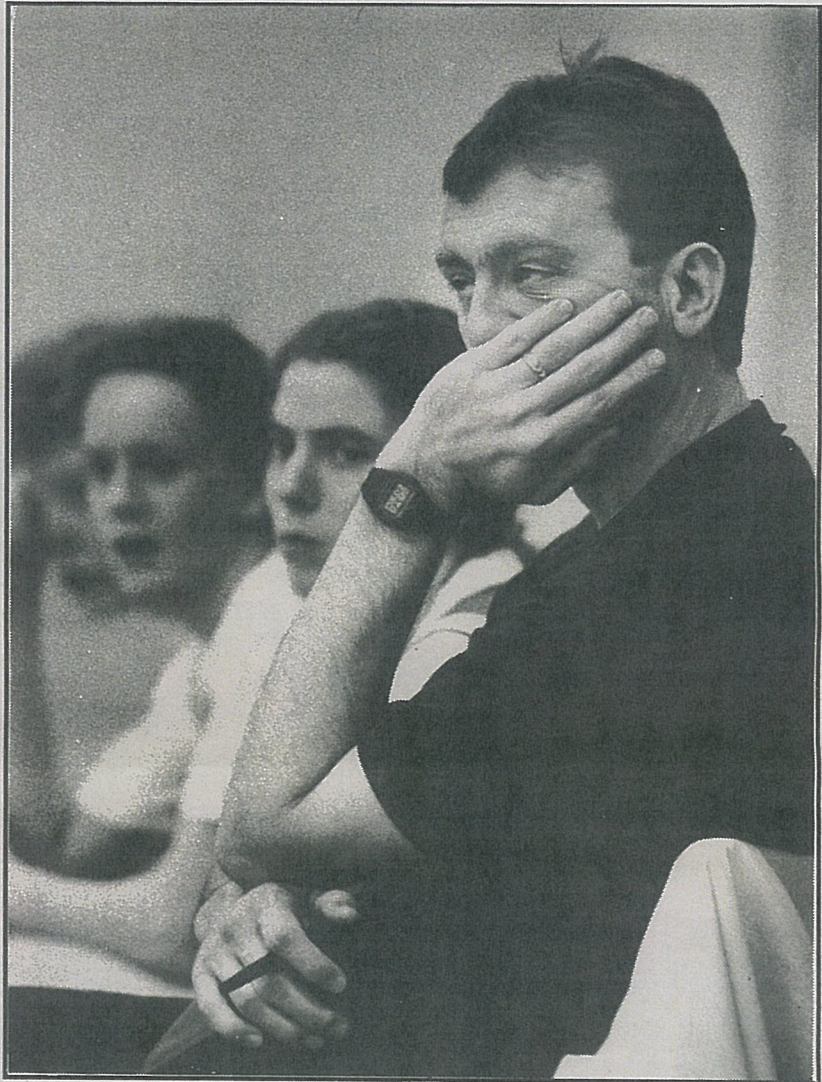
The Northwest Territories (16 gold, 20 silver, 27 bronze) have also put in a strong showing, and the Albertans (five gold, eight silver, 12 bronze) have been very impressive in certain events.

The incredible badminton players on the relatively Greenland (four gold, four silver, three bronze) contingent helped them put up great results as well.

The lone Russian ulu, a silver by Alexander "Tasmanian Devil" Tasmanov, sticks out like a red thumb. This amiable biathlete, who is a student at St. Petersburg Teaching Institute, impressed both on and off the trails.

Tasmanov and his teammates brought a new flavor to the AWG that will hopefully be back in Great Slave, Alberta in 1994. They demonstrated some intriguing sports from their homeland to Whitehorse audiences, and in turn, they will bring back a stockload of stories and new sporting activities to help warm the hearts in Siberia.

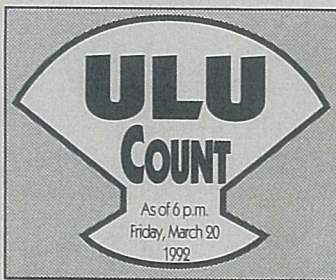
Another fellow *rushin'* on the biathlon circuit was Thane Phillips. Phillips grabbed a pair of gold ulus.

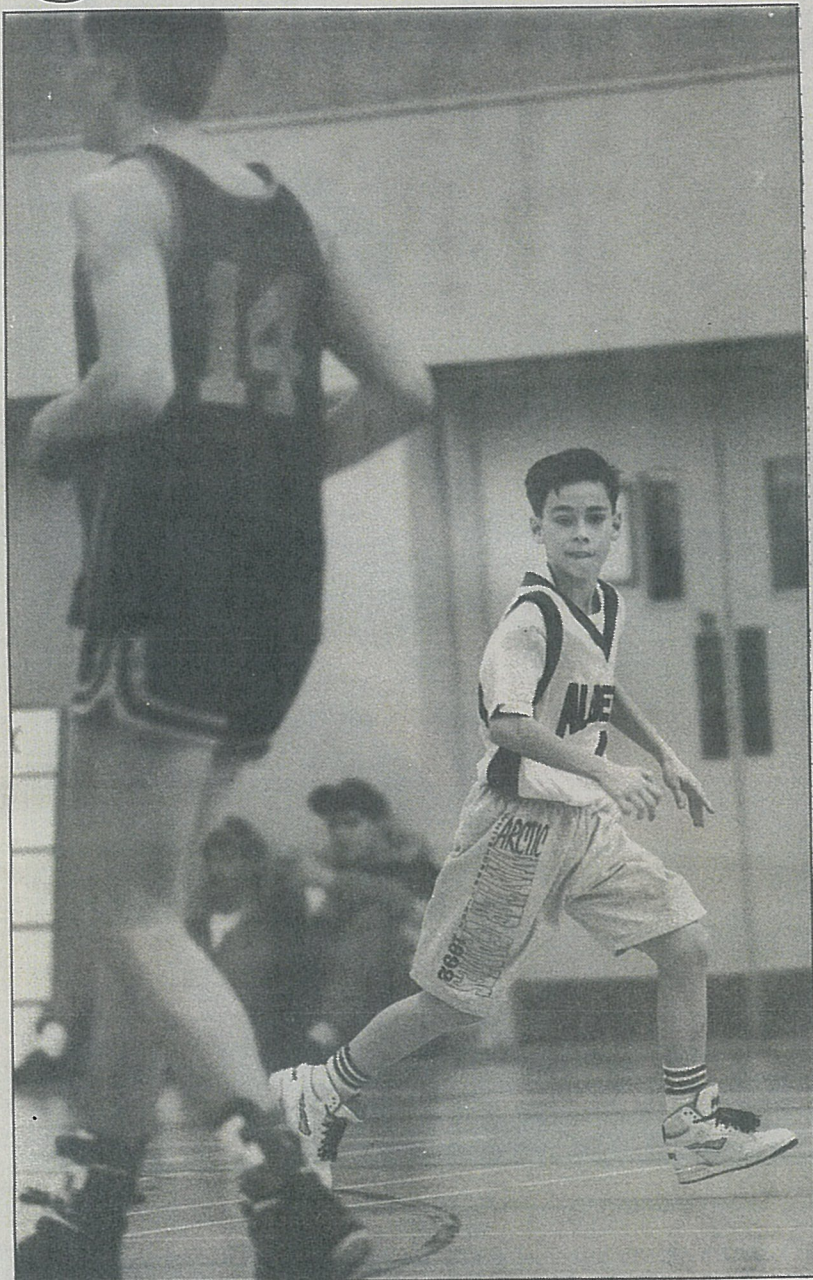

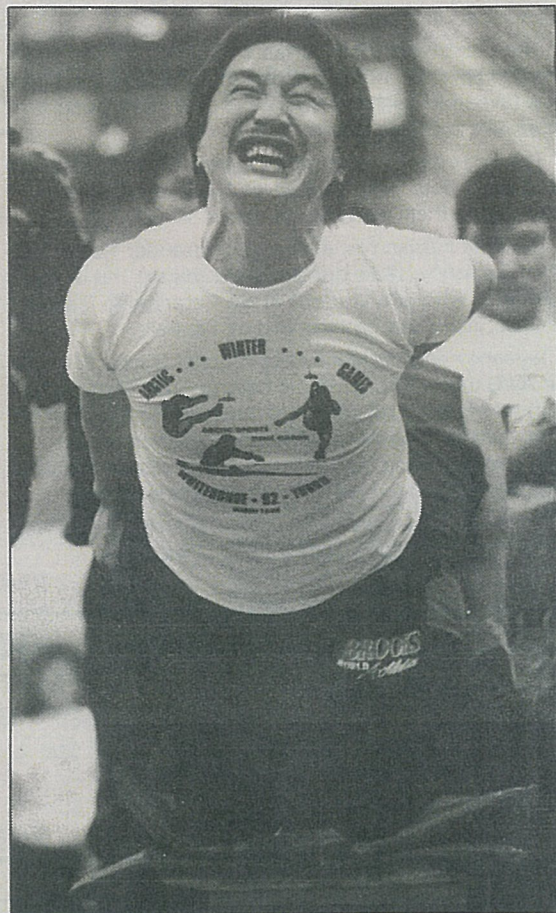

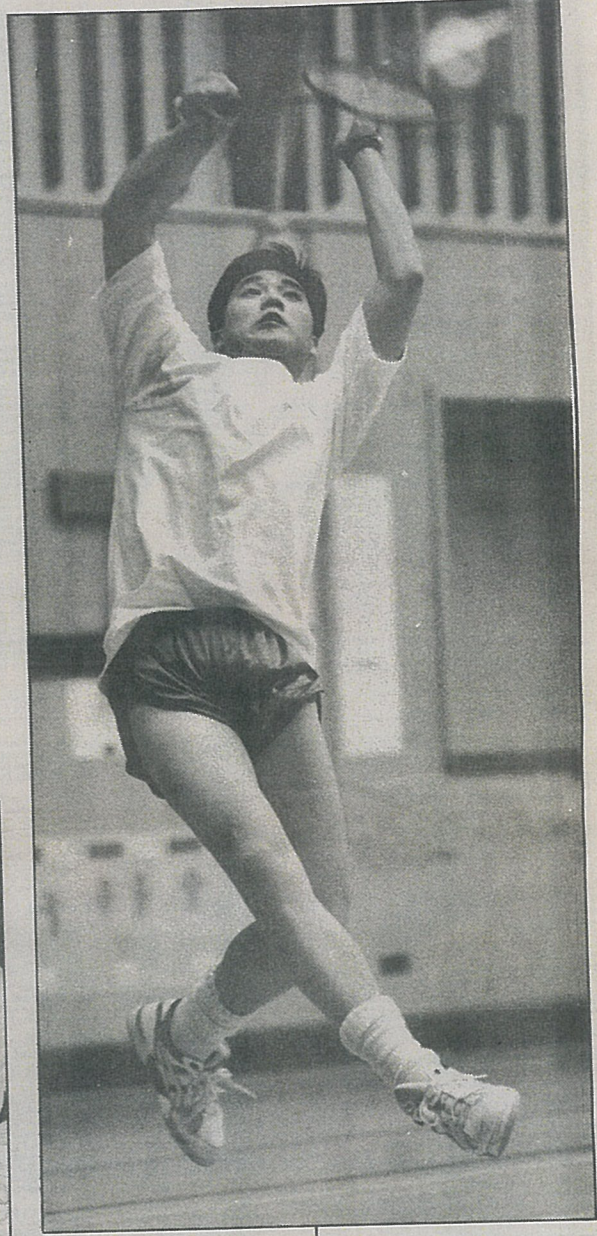

The next AWG: What's in store for '94

Our thanks to CBC Yukon for allowing the Ulu News to bring you this interview. Radio Noon host Janet Patterson interviewed Nazir Magani, President of the Games '94 Host Society, on Friday in Whitehorse.

It's a good bet that Nazir Magani has been paying closer attention to the Arctic Winter Games than almost any one else. He's from Slave Lake, Alberta, site of the competition two years from now.

I imagine that you've been seeing these games a little bit differently from most people. I just wonder what your impressions are of how these games have gone.

Oh, we've found that (Whitehorse) has had their share of problems, but most of their work has been successful. What I've seen, and my committee has seen, is that the Host Society here has gone through these games without any major problems — nothing that they can't handle.

They can be proud of what they've done so far.

You mentioned that there have been some problem areas though - have you seen anything

that you'll try to do differently in '94?

I think what we will have to do is go back to Slave Lake, rest for a few days ... this has been a really tiring week for us!

We'll put everything on paper and go back to the drawing board and see how we've organized everything so far and what can we do to make '94 a success.

Are you pretty excited about hosting the '94 games?

We are very excited, very excited indeed.

Tell us a little bit about Slave Lake ... I don't even know how many people live there!

Slave Lake is approximately 150 miles (200 km) north of Edmonton. It's at the east end of Lesser Slave Lake, the largest body of water in Alberta. It's known as where the trail meets, so when you look at the map, it's right bang-on in the centre of Alberta.

What's the population of Slave Lake?

It's about 6,000. The people, the Metis, the Beaver and the Cree Indians settled in what was originally called Sawridge, Slave Lake used to be called Sawridge. They participated in the early exploration and

fur trade.

Today, of course, their descendants continue to contribute a rich culture and language heritage within the well-integrated community.

Although the population proper is 6,000, when you look at the trading area population, we have a population of about 20,000. The population is quite young half of the people are about 25 years old or younger.

It's a community of volunteers. A typical resident is 24 years old, has two school-age children, and is involved with probably two volunteer groups.

Wow! You mentioned the cultural aspect of the community, and of course in the Arctic Winter Games culture is such an important part of the festival. It sounds like Slave Lake has a lot to offer in that regard.

Oh it has! We went to a culture show Thursday night, and you could see that this is no different, that the only thing we'll be able to do when we go back to Slave Lake in '94 is to do the same culture exchange.

We're going to bring all this culture that's now here, bring it to Slave Lake and share it with you. It's

a nice culture exchange, and it goes hand in hand with the philosophy of the Arctic Winter Games.

What about facilities at Slave Lake? Are you going to have to build any new facilities to host the games?

We have all the major facilities. The only one we're lacking is a second arena. Three or four years ago there was an arena-twinning society, and in the long range plan, it mentioned that Slave Lake needs a second ice surface because of the demands.

With Slave Lake hosting the '94 games, this process will have to be expedited to make sure we have the secondary arena in place for the '94 games.

Other than that, most of the facilities are in place.

One of the criteria used by the Arctic Winter Games board was to make sure that all facilities are in place, all the accommodation facilities are in place. They were pretty satisfied with what we have.

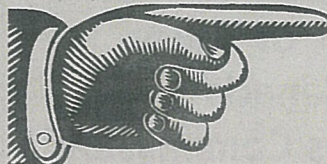
